## Crochet Amigurumi Candy Corn



Using yellow yarn and working in the round,
Row 1: 8 sc in Magic Ring (8 sts)
Row 2: 2 sc in each st around (16 sts)
Row 3: [sc in next st, 2 sc in next st] 8 times ( 24 sts)
Row 4: [sc in next 2 sts, inc in next st] 8 times ( 32 sts)
Row 5: [sc in next 3 sts, sc in next 2 sts, inc in next st] 8 times ( 40 sts)
Row 6: [sc in next 3 sts, inv dec in next st] 8 times ( 32 sts )
Row 7-9: sc in each st around ( 32 sts )
Switch to orange yarn,
Rows 10: sc in each st around (32 sts)
Rows 11: [sc in next 6 sts, inv dec in next st] 4 times ( 28 sts)
Row 12: sc in each st around ( 28 sts)
Supplies:

- Yarn

- Yellow (10 yds)
- Orange (10 yds)
- White (5 yds)
- Crochet Hook (2 sizes smaller than yarn suggests)
- Polyester filling
- Yarn needle
- Scissors
- (optional) Safety Eyes, felt or yarn for eyes/mouth
- (optional) Paper wrapped floral wire (for vines)


## Abbreviations:

- sc single crochet
- st/sts stitch/stitches
- inc increase (2 sts in the next stitch)
- inv dec invisible decrease - working in Front Loops only, decrease (join next 2 stitches into 1 )

If desired, add eyes and mouth at this point, between rows $8 \& 9$, about 6 sts apart. Safety eyes should not be used on items for children under 3 years old since they can be a choking hazard.
Row 13: [sc in next 5 sts, inv dec in next st] 4 times ( 24 sts)
Row 14: sc in each st around ( 24 sts)
Row 15: [sc in next 4 sts, inv dec in next st] 4 times (20 sts)
Add stuffing and switch to white yarn,
Row 16: sc in each st around ( 20 sts)
Row 17: [sc in next 3 sts, inv dec in next st] 4 times (16 sts)
Row 18: sc in each st around (16 sts)
Row 19: [sc in next 2 sts, inv dec in next st] 4 times (12 sts)


Add more stuffing if desired. Fasten off, leaving a tail to close off the remaining stitches.
Row 20: [sc in next st, inv dec in next st] 4 times ( 8 sts )
Finishing: Slst, Fasten off, leaving a tail to close the remaining stitches.
