

Crochet Amigurumi Snowballs



Supplies:

- Bernat Baby Blanket Yarn – White
- Crochet Hook Size N (9mm)
- Polyester filling
- Yarn needle
- Scissors
- Optional: Canvas or Organza sack to hold your snowballs

Special Stitches & Abbreviations

- **sc** single crochet
- **st/sts** stitch/stitches
- **inc** increase (2 sts in the next stitch)
- **inv dec** invisible decrease - working in Front Loops only, decrease (join next 2 stitches into 1)
- **Magic Ring** Scan QR for Instructions ->



With White Yarn and working in the round...

Row 1: 8 sc in Magic Ring (8 sts)

Row 2: 2 sc in each st around (16 sts)

Row 3: [sc in next st, 2 sc in next st] 8 times (24 sts)

Row 4-6: sc in each st around (24 sts)

Row 7: [sc in next st, inv dec in next st] 8 times (16 sts)

Add stuffing at this point

Row 8: inv dec around (8 sts)

Add more stuffing if desired.

Fasten off, leaving long tail to close off the remaining stitches.

Tips & Tricks

The pattern for these snowballs is really simple, but it does help learn some tips for working with this chunky yarn.

- When using a **Magic Ring** to start, you want to put at least 8 sc stitches, otherwise it turns more cone shaped. This pattern can be modified to start with 10 or 12 stitches... it would just affect the stitch counts for each row.
- I find that I like to **yarn under**, rather than yarn over on my stitches to get the consistent pattern on the outside.
- If the stitches are feeling too thick and rigid, I find working in the **front loop only** of the stitches makes it a bit more flexible (and the back loop tends to prevent larger holes between the stitches).
