## Crochet Amigurumi Tree



## Supplies:

- Worsted Yarn in 2 colors

- Crochet Hook (2 sizes smaller than yarn suggests)
- Polyester filling
- Yarn needle
- Scissors

Special Stitches \& Abbreviations

- Magic Ring magic ring (QR instructions on the left)
- BLO working in the back loop only
- FLO working in the front loop only
- sc single crochet
- hdc half double crochet
- dc double crochet
- st/sts stitch/stitches
- inc increase (2 sts in the next stitch)
- inv dec invisible decrease - working in Back Loops only, decrease (join next 2 stitches into 1)

Body
Using green, or color desired for the body of the tree:
Row 1: 8 sc in Magic Ring (8 sts)
Row 2: 2 sc in each st around ( 16 sts )
Row 3: [sc in next st, 2 sc in next st] 8 times ( 24 sts)
Row 4: [sc in next 2 sts, inc in next st] 8 times ( 32 sts)
Row 5: [sc in next 3 sts, inc in next st] 8 times ( 40 sts )
Row 6: [sc in next 4 sts, inc in next st] 8 times, slst, ch 1 ( 48 sts)
Row 7: Working in the back loop only (BLO) on this and remaining rows, sc in the next 2 sts, hdc, in the next 2 sts, then dc around (48
sts)
Row 8: [dc in next 10 sts, inv dec] 4 times ( 44 sts)
Row 9: [dc in next 9 sts, inv dec] 4 times ( 40 sts )
Row 10: [dc in next 8 sts, inv dec] 4 times ( 36 sts)
Row 11: [dc in next 7 sts, inv dec] 4 times ( 32 sts)
Row 12: [dc in next 6 sts, inv dec] 4 times ( 28 sts)
Row 13: [dc in next 5 sts, inv dec] 4 times ( 24 sts)
Row 14: [dc in next 4 sts, inv dec] 4 times ( 20 sts)
Row 15: [dc in next 8 sts, inv dec] 4 times ( 16 sts)
Row 16: [dc in next 8 sts, inv dec] 4 times (12 sts)
Add stuffing at this point.
Row 17: [dc in next 8 sts, inv dec] 4 times (8 sts)
Row 18: [dc in next 8 sts, inv dec] 4 times (4 sts)
Fasten off

## Decorations

Using alternate yarn:
Row 1: slst yarn in front loop of last stitch completed (at the top of Note: Using a variegated or sparkle yarn, as the tree), then working in the Front Loop Only (FLO), [sc in the next st, well as, crocheting in beads or other ch 3, skip next st] repeating until you reach the bottom of the tree. Slst and fasten off.

Note: This starts the transition to spiral rows that will be used later for the decorations
embellishments, can add a lot of detail for minimal effort.
