Crochet Flower Crown or Garland

Supplies:

- Yarn (small amounts of desired colors)
- Crochet Hook (size recommended for yarn)
- Yarn needle
- Scissors

Abbreviations:

• **ch** chain

slst slip stitch

• sc single crochet

• hdc half double crochet

• **dc** double crochet

• **st/sts** stitch/stitches

This is a no-sew pattern so I create the flowers first. You can use any flower pattern if you follow the "No-sew tip" below.

Flower (make as many as you want in whatever colors you want)

Row 1: In Magic Ring, [ch 2, 4 dc, ch 2, slst] 5 times.

Optionally, you can ch 4, slst to beginning ch and work the stitches in the ch-4 loop.

No-sew tip: After tightening the Magic Ring closed, tie off but don't cut the yarn. With flower turned to the back, ch 3, slst on the opposite side of the flower. Fasten off.

Small leaf

Ch 5, sc, hdc, hdc, sc, slst

Large leaf

Ch 2, in 2nd ch from hook: 2 sc, hdc, dc, then create a mini picot (ch2, slst in 2nd ch from hook), dc, hdc, 2sc

Bobble leaf

Ch 4, hdc in 3rd ch from hook, slst in

Leaf Garland

This garland is free-form, so that may take a little getting used to. I like to start and end with a Bobble leaf using a random number of ch sts between leaves and flowers. Flowers are attached as you go by placing a slst in the back ch-3 loop we created. You can slst to join to fit around your head as well if desired.



Note: you can add other embellishments as well, like beads or buttons to the center of the flowers



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
