## Crochet Dragonscale or Fairy Bag

## Supplies:



- Yarn (80 yds) (Ferris Wheel works great)
- Crochet Hook (size recommended for yarn)
- Yarn needle
- Scissors
- (optional) Beads for cord


## Abbreviations:

- ch chain
- slst slip stitch
- sc single crochet
- dc double crochet
- st/sts stitch/stitches
- inc increase (2 sts in the next stitch)
- Crocodile Stitch - working in side of first dc, work 5 dc, ch1, turn to work 5 dc in $2^{\text {nd }} \mathrm{dc}$.
- Leaf Stitch - working in side of first dc, work 5 dc , ch 3 , slst in $1^{\text {st }} \mathrm{ch}$, turn to work 5 dc in $2^{\text {nd }} \mathrm{dc}$.


## Starting at the bottom of the bag,

Row 1: 8 sc in Magic Ring ( 8 sts )
Row 2: 2 sc in each st around ( 16 sts )
Row 3: [sc in next sc, 2 sc in next st] around ( 24 sts)
Row 4: [sc in next 2 sts, 2 sc in next st] around ( 32 sts)
Row 5: [sc in next 3 sts, 2 sc in next st] around ( 40 sts)
Row 6: [sc in next 4 sts, 2 sc in next st] around ( 48 sts )
Row 7: ch 4 (counts as $1^{\text {st }}$ dc plus a ch 1), skip 1 st, [2 dc, ch 1 , skip 1 st, dc, ch 1, skip 1st] around, slst in $3^{\text {rd }}$ st of initial ch-4 [ $36 \mathrm{dc}, 24 \mathrm{ch}$ ]
Row 8: [Crocodile st (or Leaf st) on each 2-dc group, slst in each single dc st] around, slst in top of initial ch-3 ( 12 crocodile/leaf sts)

## Magic Ring

Note: You can make the bag bigger
or smaller by increasing or decreasing the number or rows here.

Row 9: ch 3, dc in the same st, [ch1, dc in center of Crocodile st, ch1, 2 dc in single dc st between scales/leaves] repeat around
Repeat the last 2 rows 6 times or until the bag is the desired height.

## Adding loops for drawstring

Row 10: Ch 3, slst in each opening around the top

## Drawstring (make 2)

Row 1: ch 100 (or until the string fits around the diameter or your bag)
Weave it through the loops created previously. If desired, add a bead to each string to make it easy to find, then slst to the beginning ch. Fasten off and weave in ends. When adding the $2^{\text {nd }}$ drawstring, place the bead on the opposite side of the bag. Cording works great for this too.
